WEEE Policy Statement

Contour Electronics Ltd and WEEE

The European Union's (EU) Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive 2002/96/EC came into effect in February 2003. The directive imposes the responsibility for the disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment on the producers of such equipment. As a supplier of interconnect products (components and sub-assemblies), Contour Electronics Ltd does not directly produce EEE as defined in WEEE's Annex 1A.

Contour Electronics Ltd and WEEE

The European Union's (EU) Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive 2002/96/EC came into effect in February 2003. WEEE is not specifically a product substance restriction requirement like RoHS, but rather sets collection, recycling and recovery targets for various types of electrical and electronic equipment. The directive imposes the responsibility for the disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment on the producers of such equipment.

WEEE requirements focus on producers of 'electrical and electronic equipment' or "EEE" as defined in Article 3(a) of the Directive. The Directive specifies categories of "EEE" covered by the requirements in Annex 1A. The Categories of 'EEE' identified in Annex 1A are: large and small household appliances; IT and telecommunications equipment; consumer equipment; lighting equipment; electrical and electronic tools; toys, leisure and sports equipment; medical devices; monitoring and control instruments; and automatic dispensers.

As a supplier of interconnect products (components and sub-assemblies), Contour Electronics Ltd does not directly produce "EEE" as defined in WEEE's Annex 1A. As a result, the marking, collection, recycling and recovery targets identified under the WEEE Directive do not directly apply to Contour Electronics Ltd products.
